

# HOW TO PAINT URBAN BASES










## PAINTS USED

 - Matt Black Spray


 - Oak Brown


 - Fur Brown


 - Prarie Ochre

 - Buffed Hide

 - Barren Dune


 - Opal Skin

 - Tundra Taupe

 - Soft Tone



## **PAINTING KEY**

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- A rectangular border made of brown barbed wire, with the wire looping and crossing at the corners and along the sides, framing the painting key text.
- (B)** - Basecoat
  - (L)** - Layer
  - (H)** - Highlight
  - (W)** - Wash
  - (G)** - Glaze
  - (RW)** - Recess Wash
  - (WD)** - Watered Down
  - (DB)** - Drybrush
  - (OB)** - Overbrush
  - (AB)** - Airbrush

Note: Paints used are from The Army Painter range



**TIP:**

Mix a few small rocks with your sand and fix them in place with PVA glue to give the base more texture and variety. For extra detail, add 'bricks' like those from the plastic Konflikt '47 ruins kit.

# STEP 3



**BRICKS:**  
Fur Brown (B)

**SAND:**  
Oak Brown (B)





**BRICKS:**  
Buffed Hide (DB)

**SAND:**  
Prairie Ochre (DB)

### TIP:

Use an Army Painter Wargamer Large Drybrush to pick out the raised sand texture and the edges of the bricks. Don't worry about being too precise, if a little Prairie Ochre catches thy bricks it will still look natural.



# STEP 5



**BRICKS:**  
Opal Skin (DB)

**SAND:**  
Barren Dune (DB)





### TIP:

Thin down some Soft Tone with a little water and brush a light coat over the bricks.  
This will give them a subtle dirty weathered look  
- Perfect for that battle worn feel!
